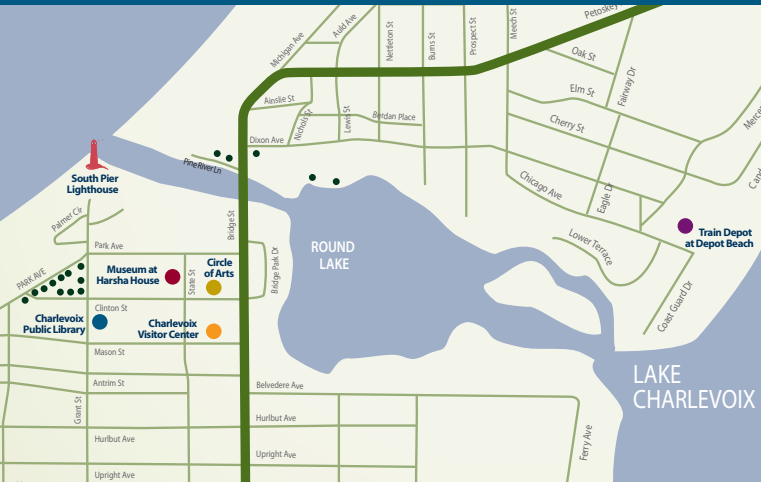

The Harsha House, built in 1892 by local businessman and community leader Horace S. Harsha, has been the home of the Historical Society since 1978.

Attractions include rotating exhibits, thousands of historic photos, local artifacts, research materials, Earl A. Young Mushroom House information & tours, Grays Reef Lighthouse Fresnel lens, an original Ernest A. Hemingway marriage license, Museum Gift Shop featuring books, maps, photos, and more.

The Charlevoix Train Depot, built in 1892, has been restored with the help of fundraisers, grants and generous donations from the community.

On the grounds is the beautiful Heritage Garden, maintained by the Charlevoix Area Garden Club, which overlooks Depot Beach on Lake Charlevoix. It is used for Society programs on local history, and for exhibits, social events, and other activities.

South Pier Lighthouse

Walk the Pier seasonally, view the Lighthouse year-round.

The Charlevoix South Pier Lighthouse is owned by the City of Charlevoix and maintained by the Charlevoix Historical Society.

The United States Coast Guard is responsible for operation of the light. In 2009 the lighthouse was restored to its historically significant red color. The restoration was made possible thanks to generous donations from the community and matching grants from the Michigan State Historic Preservation Office under the Michigan Lighthouse Assistance Program.

US Lighthouse Society's Passport Program stamps are available at the Museum at Harsha House.
